## Montrose Boulevard

#### Conservancy

The goal of the conservancy is to beautify Montrose Boulevard. An old photograph shows a view from Richmond south to the reflecting pool in Hermann Park. The intent is to connect Allen Park with Memorial Park through a beautiful, green Montrose Boulevard. The first phase of the master plan calls for new, wide sidewalks, safe street crossings, plantings of Live Oaks, and little islands with art works. In the second phase an esplanade is planned from Westheimer to the Mecom fountain. This would regulate traffic, and increase the safety of crossing the street. 

## Registered Live Oak

The Live Oak in front of Lynne Gevirtz' bungalow at 3811 Audubon Place is included in the Harris County Tree Registry. It is indexed as number 263, has a circumference of 181 inches, is 54 feet high with a spread of 114 feet! Only 6 registered Live Oaks (Quercus Virginiana) are larger than "Our Tree".



The crime rate is creeping up in our area. We have asked HPD to increase the number of patrols to help alleviate the problem.





### Historic District

On December 11, 2008 the Houston Archaeological and Historical Commission unanimously approved the staff recommendation to designate Audubon Place as a Historic District. On December 18 the Planning Commission also approved the recommendation. The HD ordinance has been in effect for our neighborhood since October 29, pending ultimate approval by the full City Council.

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## Audubon Place Historic District

The proposed boundaries of our Historic District have been chosen to include as many properties as possible while still having the required 51% of the owners supporting the designation. The boundary mostly follows the APA area, except on the West side, where it goes from the alley North of Hawthorne through the middle of Roseland to Harold. It then turns West to the allev West of Roseland; then South to Marshall, West to Montrose, South to the alley South of Marhsall. Then it goes East to the alley West of Roseland and finally South to W. Alabama. You will now agree that drawing a map is a darn sight easier then describing a route.

The final tally of the number of tracts owners that signed the petition is 55%, involving 123 owners of 230 tracts.

On these tracts there are 223 sites, 133 of which are historic or contributing or 60%.


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## New Slate of Officers
